Understanding SPIRITUAL FATHERING in the Apostolic

Spiritual fathering shares some parallel with natural fathering. Natural fathering starts with the release of the male seed to make contact with the female egg. Fertilisation occurs and very soon a baby is formed in the womb of the female (receiver of seed). Natural fathering goes on to nurture that which is formed in the womb by providing care for the one carrying the baby. When the baby is born, the care is expected to continue. The carrier of the womb plays a major role in the final outcome of the baby. The feeding, caring and attending to the baby cannot be delegated to any. The father simply provides support for mother and child. Loving and caring, building and helping, correcting and encouraging all go with fathering. In the natural, we have men who can impregnate a woman without taking responsibility for the seed. This may be because of immaturity, carelessness or simply due to lack of emotional or mental stability.

Spiritually speaking, we all have wombs and we all are capable of releasing seed. There is no male or female

in the spirit. The parallels get more and more interesting. In the natural, the formation of seed in a man is a function of physical maturity i.e. the coming to a certain age. In the spiritual, a man's seed is the result of his process in God. That seed, when developed, has the power to impact the eggs of another to produce a "baby" whose DNA is similar to the fathers. This "baby" is the baby of destiny to him who carries it. There are many fathers who are used by God to activate the destiny-babies of many around the world. Through their messages, men/women who have been and are going through process spread their seed to any who cares to receive. God causes people to father works, churches, movements and to birth insights into the body of Christ. These fathers then can be used of God to give direction and strength to many in the BODY OF CHRIST. Nothing however, should take the place of our personal relationship with God by His Spirit and through His Word. The purpose He has for us also determines what influences us. Not all are influenced by the same things or messages. A spiritual father is not just one who leads you to Christ as we

have believed; rather he is one who God has used to deposit in you that which is a product of his process with God. The substance deposited has the life-force to effect definite changes in you and produce in you the outworking of a new dimension of God within you. That which is produced in you will help you understand the dealings of God in your life and how to navigate through the conflicts and confusion that marks the Christian walk. Paul, the apostle, had only few sons but many fellow labourers. We are not told who Paul's spiritual father was and he did not go about trying to father everyone whom he came across.

THE ULTIMATE FATHER
God is the ultimate Father. He fathered the new creation by the seed of His Word. He is the Father, Creator and the One from whom everything derives its life, meaning and function. The Bible says in 1 Peter 1:23, "Being born again not of corruptible seed, but of God, which lives and abides forever". The seed of God is incorruptible and lives forever. The life of God is in His seed. The ultimate Father carries the ultimate seed. By it He births and creates and causes to happen all He desires. No earthly father was designed

to take the place of the Father-God but rather to model some aspects of His nature and attributes for their protégé or son to follow and to know the true nature of the Father-God. "For this cause, I bow my knees unto the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ of whom the whole family in heaven and earth is named". (Ephesians 3:14-15). All fatherhood takes its bearing from the Father-God. It is the will of God that different aspects of His creation will take portions of Him and cause His will to be experienced on earth.

The Father's loving kindness and tender mercies need to be shown alongside His justice and standards through our personal relationships on earth. An earthly father, at his best, will try to show the natural love and correction of the heavenly Father so as to help the child to relate with the dealings of God for his future. We all know that many natural fathers have failed to do this.


The ultimate Father also has provision for spiritual fathering. This happens when the son or daughter is being prepared for the purpose

that God put him or her here on earth to accomplish. God brings some aspect of His Being into close proximity to the person through a fathering spirit. Spiritual fathering is about fulfilling purposes in God. It is about getting activated by the God-given grace or ability in another to enhance your own destiny that God ordained for you. There should be some recognition of this process by at least one person before the other person gets to see it all.

One of the roles the apostolic grace comes to play is to father people into their destinies. In this article we want to see how Fathering impacts future generations and how God sees the role of fathers in His economy. It has become very clear that many will miss out on the path to their destiny, because of the work of the flesh or the natural up bringing of the person or even the environmental factors surrounding their

development. If there are no fathers or leaders to lead aright and help navigate away from the stumbling stones on the way, many will indeed miss the mark. Without the fathering grace many will surely go astray from the path God has ordained for them. Of course, being helped or guided by the influence of another is a matter of choice, but those who were blessed to have good



Definitely, no one is to take the blame if another makes wrong choices. All I am saying here is that fathers can help others navigate carefully to avoid the big issues that stop many in their tracks.

For every godly and Kingdom principle or issue, there is a perversion or abuse that is possible too. It's the same with fathering. Many can claim to have suffered in the hands of so-called fathers who used them rather than built them, who skinned them rather than clothed them. **Abuse happens when the flesh takes on a godly thing and utilises it with an impure motive.** The outcome is usually disastrous for all. The flesh has perverted many things that God restored in the recent past. The principle of prosperity for instance has been perverted by greed in the flesh.

Mammon has become the god of some people because of the so-called prosperity message. We are not to read greed into the creed. We are designed to win with righteousness. Even the principle of submission can be used by the flesh to oppress people. The flesh is a hydra-headed monster, especially when allowed to co-operate with the religious spirits, it has the potential to destroy any good thing in God's Kingdom. No wonder the Bible says we should crucify the flesh and the lusts therein. The flesh represents the part of the fallen nature that has not

undergone the crucifying effect of the cross in submission to the Lordship of Jesus Christ. For many who are willing to serve the Lord, the flesh stands as an obstacle to their pure motives. When motives are not right in God's eyes whatever is done is not acceptable to Him, no matter how 'good' it looks, 'good' is not necessarily godly.

THE MAKING OF A FATHER

1 John 2:12-17 says "I write to you, dear children, because your sins have been forgiven on account of his name. I write to you, fathers, because you have known him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you have overcome the evil one. I write to you, dear children, because you have known the Father. I write to you, fathers, because you have known him who is from the beginning. I write to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God lives in you, and you have overcome the evil one. Do not love the world or anything in the world. If anyone loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For everything in the world—the cravings of sinful man, the lust of his eyes and the boasting of what he has and does—comes not from the Father but from the world. The world and its desires pass away, but the man who does the will of God lives forever."

Fathers are said to have known Him who was from the beginning. To know here implies intimacy or intercourse. To know Him who was from the beginning means to have had intimacy with Him. One word that describes knowing Him is PROCESS. Natural fathering has the similitude to spiritual fathering. In the natural a man or young boy can impregnate a woman or girl but to father the baby implies taking responsibility for the upkeep and well-being of the baby. That responsibility is a mark of maturity. Fathering is for the mature and maturing involves

process. Process is that which one goes through that brings about death to the sinful nature in man, by confronting the true state of the heart and self-denial of the tendency to walk in the flesh. Process usually helps us to sort out the external frills from the substance of relationship with God. We are able to separate the carnal from the spiritual; that which pleases us from that which pleases God. This leads to a newness of life that flows from God, depends on God and glorifies Him. Christ will truly be living in us when we are through with this phase of process.

On the mount of transfiguration, Elijah and Moses appeared with Jesus and the disciples saw them. They represented the Law (Moses) and the Prophets (Elijah). One unique thing about both Moses and Elijah was that they both transmitted their calling and grace to the next generation after them. They fathered another to continue the purposes of God in their times. Could this mean that God reckons with those who father others in their calling? The lives of these two men reveal the fathering process they went through. Another father we cannot overlook in the Bible is father-Abraham. He went through process too. **Fathering is a calling from God. Not everyone is called to father others.** God raises fathers and reveals them to sons and the revelation

of the fathering spirit stirs up the destiny-call in sons. The stirrings of destiny can be seen when Elizabeth, the mother of John heard the greeting of Mary the mother of Jesus, the baby in her belly leapt and was filled with the Holy Spirit there and then. Whenever that stirring occurs in our spirits, it is usually the stirrings of destiny. The 'baby' (Destiny) in your spiritual womb will leap for joy at the sound of the words from the one whose destiny is connected to yours, especially when the Spirit of God is making the connection between you.

A look at Elijah's life will give us some insights into the making of a father. In 1 Kings 17, we are introduced to this fiery prophet of God who has learnt to stand before God. Through his intimacy with God he was able to know the heart of God and under instruction acted as His spokesman. He gave judgement from God that there will be no rain for three and a half years. It was also the beginning of His process. His provision was granted in spite of the judgement on earth. His provision was guaranteed on his obedience to the "Word of the Lord". Cherith represents a place of humbling. The ravens feeding Elijah was a development in dependence on God. Ravens are flesh eating birds, having to depend on them takes more faith than we have thought about. He must have really depended on God in waiting for flesh-eating birds to bring

him flesh and bread to eat. It's a miracle of great proportions if you think about it. The supply was assured on the condition that he obeyed the Word of the Lord. All dependence on the natural was cut off to obey God. Anytime this happens the flesh feels the pain. The unregenerate self (the flesh) likes to be independent, self-centred and hold its future and plans in its own hands. This obedience runs against the grain of the flesh and its thought patterns. How do you think flesh eating birds can feed you? When reasoning takes over, it has every opportunity to knock off obedience in the life of the person. His obedience was the key to his supply. If he left the place of obedience then he would be bidding his supply goodbye. This is major in our spiritual journey to maturity. Your obedience must be tested and established. Really there is not much that God can do in us if we cannot get our obedience tested. Many have never even heard anything from God that has the slightest way of proving or testing their obedience. Every such instruction that could have tested their obedience is "shouted" upon by the flesh and crushed so that it does not even make sense to them. There will be no clarity in their hearing because of the rebellion in them that will not permit the process to even start. When last did you hear an instruction that did not make sense? Back to Elijah, after the first

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

Have you ever judged God's presence in your life based on what you are going through? Many have the notion that if things are going well, God is with them.

In today's church, how would we respond to someone who was going through what Joseph in the Bible went through? When he ended up in the pit and later in prison, most of us would have judged him to be out of the will of God. But the truth is that God was taking Joseph through a process. Before God can use us He must process us. Process is the pathway to destiny.

This series will help you to identify where you are in God's programme so that you can recognise and pass your tests. Included in this series are the following anointed messages; Positioning for Process, Pathways to Destiny and

phase of the test, the brook dried up. The process shifts into another gear. The habit of staying in the presence of the Lord had been established in the servant of God. The stopping of provision will send "prosperity snatchers" on warfare against the enemy. No, it was not satan but God wanting to move the programme to the next phase. Go to Zarephath, now go and bless another person. On getting there he finds a widow woman at the gate who simply had enough for herself and her son to eat and die, being the last piece. Can you see, if he had not learnt to depend on the Lord by keeping His Word, he will never be in a POSITION to handle this level in the process. Absolute dependence on God is what causes the 'men' to stand apart from the 'boys' in the walk of destiny. Many fail their tests and wonder why they cannot handle the challenges that come their way. Your success at one level prepares you for the next level. "Wilderness" is usually a place of testing, but because many do not even know the nature of their tests, they fail and remain in the wilderness for a long time. Its time to ask for the opening of our eyes! Elijah had learnt to depend on God, now he needed to carry others into this state of dependence on God. That is where fathering starts. **So, before we talk of fathering we should really talk of maturing.** It is not a function of length of years of being born again. Many are babies though they have been born again for many years. They have refused to go on with God as His ways do not agree with their heads. To get the woman and her

son on this faith-living and having provision supernaturally, he needed to speak the prophetic word, apply the principle of giving and receiving, putting God first and honouring the servant of God. He activated her faith in God's supernatural provision. Her willingness was necessary to help her connection too. Like Elijah, she had to believe and act on what she believed. There is always supernatural provision for all who will press in to hear the Word of the Lord, and act in faith and mature in their obedience as they refuse to be moved by what they see but by the Word of God. Now, getting others to climb in and take advantage of your intimacy with God and sustain them there is the beginning of fathering. She had to believe in God, in His prophet and had to trust her future into God's hands through her obedience to His servant who spoke to her. I can see why God sent the prophet to her. She must have been believing and crying out to God. Three factors stand out here, 1) God's provision, 2) Elijah's walk with God, 3) Her faith in God and Elijah. The last two are the variables and either of them can hinder the manifestation of God's merciful provision on the earth. May we remember this when next we blame God for a lack of provision in our lives. Elijah was bold to say go bake for me first then go and do like you have said. That was faith speaking. Elijah lived with this sustaining provision till the end of the famine. The woman and her son were also sustained by the provision from heaven. All of these were part of the process of developing the fathering spirit in Elijah. When a man passes his tests in God, things


will happen that cannot be explained in the natural. Zarephath also was the headquarters of Baal worship. Elijah was positioned for the destruction of Baal worship in Israel. This is God's programme for His man in that hour. Later in the life of Elijah, Elisha caught a glimpse of the spirit that was on Elijah and he did not say "my prophet, my prophet", but "my father, my father". The seeing qualified Elisha to enter into sonship and receive the mantle of that office. Elijah passing his tests established something on earth through his obedience and the one who was privileged to enter into sonship through passing his own tests simply entered into the labours of the fathers. **Spiritual inheritance is not what can be calculated materially, it is, rather, what produces "behind the scenes"**. Elisha entered into the pathway in the spirit that Elijah had laboured to have through obedience. The seeing was the qualifier. What we see determines what we become. See 2 Corinthians 3:18 and 1John 3:2. We shall be like Him for we shall see Him as He is. Elisha saw and took upon himself what he saw. The dismantling of Jezebel's headquarters started with Elijah but continued and ended with Jehu. **God credited sons with the labours of the fathers.** Sons stand on the shoulders of fathers to do more for God. There is labour in entering the labours of fathers. We will

experience more in God than our personal process allows. This is one great advantage of fathers in God's economy.

OTHER INSIGHTS ON FATHERING FROM OTHER FATHERS

Obedience against all odds is the acid test for fathers. ABRAHAM believed God and it was counted for righteousness. From the inception of Abraham's call, obedience had been the factor that played the most major part. From leaving his father's house and going into the land he was going to be shown, to believing God to restore his son Isaac, after being offered as a sacrifice. All of these are tests and as he passed the tests he qualified for the purposes of God to be birthed through him. Isaac was both a natural and a spiritual son. He was a spiritual son because he believed in the vision and purpose of God for his father. When Isaac was to be offered, he never resisted his father and his God.

Another dimension to fathering is the fact that patterns in the father's life become the template for the son's life. Isaac did what his father did though he was not old enough or even born when his father did those things. For example, Abraham called his wife his sister to avoid being killed by Abimelech, the king. We see Isaac do similarly. The principle here is that the father's walk becomes a pattern for the son. The spiritual genes in him affect how he interprets the will of God for any situation. Fathers generate the spiritual pathways for their sons to walk in. God bless you, Rev. Kola Ewuosho



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Walking in GOD'S MERCY

The Psalmist said: "Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life." (Ps. 23:6). Recently, God began to show me that one of the ingredients that would make for victorious Christian living in these end times is, His mercy; understanding and walking in it, more than ever before.

The Bible tells us very clearly that God is a merciful God; that is one of His many attributes, and we must begin to see and know Him that way. God testified about Himself: "The LORD, the LORD God, merciful and gracious, long suffering and abounding in goodness and truth. Keeping mercy for thousands, forgiving iniquity and transgression and sin" (Ex. 34:6-9). Nehemiah said, "for you are God, gracious and merciful" (Neh. 9:31). The Psalmist said "The LORD is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in mercy." (Ps. 103:8). Jesus, in the Beatitudes told His disciples: "Therefore be merciful, just as your father also is merciful." (Luke 6:36) Jesus, in all things, had to be made like us that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God. (Heb. 2:17) God is plenteous in mercy. (Ps. 86:5,15). God's mercy endures forever (1 Chron. 16:34,41; Ps 118:1,4). God's mercy is great. (Ps. 57:10; 86:13; 103:11). The Bible talks about the multitude of God's mercy (Ps. 69:13; 5:7).

Mercy, both in the Old and New Testaments, is defined as: Compassion, Pity, Goodness, Kindness, Favour, Graciousness.

There are three major areas in which God shows His mercy:

Firstly, in our sinfulness- even when we were sinners, before we ever believed and got saved! "But God who is rich in mercy, because of His great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in His kindness toward us in Christ Jesus." (Eph. 2:4-7). The Bible says that when we were still without strength, Christ died for the ungodly. Also, God's love was demonstrated to us in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. (Rom. 5:6,8). We were reconciled to God through the death of Jesus Christ even when we were God's enemies. (Rom. 5:10). We have been saved only by grace, not by our own works lest we should boast. (Eph. 2:8-9). We didn't work to be good and acceptable to God: salvation is a gift from God. "God saved you by His special favour when you believed. And you can't take credit for this; it is a gift from God. Salvation is not a reward for the good things we have

done, so none of us can boast about it." (N.L.T) Salvation doesn't stop at the new birth, that is only the beginning. Salvation is an all encompassing word and an on-going experience. It also includes, deliverance, healing, well-being, prosperity, safety, etc.

The same way, we were not saved from eternal doom by our own works; we won't be saved from sicknesses, diseases, oppression, poverty, etc by our own works! This truth set me free years ago; **I stopped trying to get healed by my good works. I started to see healing also as a gift from God, through the finished work of Calvary.** That to me, answered the question: "What of so and so sister or brother, who served God so faithfully and yet didn't get healed?" God showed me that healing is not a reward for the good things we have done; No, it is by grace! If God showed us so much mercy when we were sinners and enemies of God, how much more will He show us great mercy now that we are His children? "Much more then having been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him." For if when we were enemies we

were reconciled to God through the death of His Son, much more, having been reconciled, we shall be saved by His life." (Rom. 5:9-10). We need to understand how that works; you are not kinder to outsiders than you are to your own children. **Charity must**

begin at home or else, that would be plain hypocrisy! Why would God show us so much love as sinners and then have nothing reserved for us now that He has wooed us to Himself? "But Zion said, 'The Lord has forsaken me, and my Lord has forgotten her nursing child, and not have compassion on the son of her womb? Surely they may forget, yet I will not forget you. See, I have inscribed you on the palms of My hands;" (Is. 49:14-16). God knew that even after we've been saved, we might still fall into sins, so He made a provision for that. "My little children, these things I write to you, **so that you may not sin.** And if anyone sins, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous." (1Jn. 2:1). God made provision, not only for the sins of the world, but also for our sins. (1Jn. 2:2). **God doesn't love you less now that you are saved.** "There

is no fear in love, but perfect love casts out fear, because fear involves torment." (1Jn. 4:18).

Secondly, God shows us His mercy in our weaknesses. Though saved, we all have areas in which we are weak; areas where we tend to fail and to fall, i.e. our faults and shortcomings. "For we do not yet have a High Priest who cannot sympathise with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find

grace to help in time of need." (Heb. 4:15-16). Jesus came to help the seed of Abraham; and because He Himself was tempted in all things, (yet without sin) He is able to help those who are tempted. (Heb. 2:16-18). Jesus told Peter that Satan had asked to sift Peter as wheat but He had prayed for him that Peter's faith should not fail. (Lk. 22:31-32). "As a father pities his children, so the Lord pities those who fear Him. For He knows our frame; (i.e. understands our constitution) He remembers that we are dust." (Ps. 103:13-14). The Bible says that God is faithful, not only will He not allow us to be tempted beyond what we are able to bear, He will also make the way of escape for us with every temptation we face. (1 Cor 10:13). What a merciful God we serve! **He is always looking out for us, not to 'get' us, but to help us out!**

Thirdly, God shows us His mercy in our distresses, troubles and afflictions. "Many are the

afflictions of the righteous, but the LORD delivers him out of them all." (Ps. 34:19). When three nations attacked Judah, King Jehoshaphat and all Judah cried out to God in their distress. God responded to them. Jehoshaphat appointed singers, who went ahead of the army saying: "Praise the LORD, for His mercy endures forever." The Bible says when they began to sing and praise, the LORD set ambushes against their enemies and they were defeated. (2 Chron. 20: 21-23) In Psalm 136, Israel attributed their victories and the destruction


of their enemies to the mercy of God. **Actually, when God shows His mercy to us in our distress, it not only means our deliverance but also the destruction or defeat of our adversary.** "And not in any way terrified of your adversaries, which is to them a proof of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that from God." (Php. 1:29). Daniel and his three friends would have been destroyed with the other wise men but Daniel ran to his friends "that they might **seek mercies** from the God of heaven concerning this secret, so that Daniel and his companions might not perish with the rest of the wise men of Babylon." (Dan. 2: 18). The secret was then revealed to Daniel in a night vision. The Bible says: "Through the LORD's mercies we are not consumed, because His compassions fail not. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness." (Lam. 3: 22, 23). Joseph was thrown into the prison because Potiphar's wife falsely accused him of attempted rape. The Bible says,

the LORD was with Joseph and showed him mercy and gave him favour in the sight of the keeper of the prison (Gen. 39:21). God's mercy also produces favour. Nehemiah asked God for mercy in the sight of the king and as a result of that he had favour with the king. The king gave him the permission to go to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem and also gave him provision and protection. Jesus ministered healing and deliverance to people as a show of mercy. Mercy is also described as God's attitude towards those who are in distress. Blind Bartimaeus cried out to Jesus, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me." (Mk. 10:4). The woman of Canaan asked Jesus for mercy on her daughter who was severely demon possessed, and the daughter was delivered. (Matt. 15:22). The father of the epileptic boy asked Jesus to have mercy on his son who was suffering severely (Matt. 17:15). Epaphroditus, Paul's helper was sick almost unto death but Paul said "God had mercy on him and not only on him but on me also lest I should have sorrow upon sorrow." (Php. 2:27). When Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist had her baby, the Bible says "when her neighbours and relatives heard how the Lord had **shown great mercy** to her, they rejoiced with her." (Lk. 1:58).

I see a great connection between **covenant and mercy**; one is not instead of or in the place of the other. The Jews were God's covenant people, yet God showed mercy to them at different times. We must understand that the basis of the covenant is God's mercy. God's covenant came to us as a result of His mercy. Someone described mercy as **"the outward**

manifestation of pity; it assumes the need on the part of him who receives it and resources adequate to meet the need on the part of him who shows it". The Almighty God in His unlimited, infinite resources, entered into covenant with man out of His mercy. "What is man that You are mindful of him, and the son of man that you visit him?" (i.e. give attention to or care for him). (Ps. 8:5) Mercy and covenant go together. "He has helped His servant Israel, in remembrance of His mercy, as He spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to His seed forever." (Luke 1: 54, 55). When the Israelites cried to God in their bondage, God remembered His covenant with their fathers and showed them mercy. Jesus healed the woman bound by the spirit of infirmity for eighteen years, because she was a daughter of Abraham (Luke 13:16) "For the mountains shall depart and the hills be removed, but my kindness shall not depart from you, nor shall my **covenant** of peace be removed." Says the LORD who has **mercy** on you." (Isa. 54:10). Can you see the connection between the covenant and mercy?

In the Old Testament, the ark of the Covenant was covered with the mercy seat. God met with the Israelites and spoke with them from above the mercy seat. (Ex. 25: 21-22).



So, you can't separate the covenant from mercy. **God's mercy works because of His covenant; and our faith only works because of God's mercy: "Faith works by love."** (Gal. 5:6).

How to Walk in God's Mercy

1) Repentance

Nehemiah repented on behalf of himself and the Israelites, and asked God to grant him mercy in the sight of the king. And God did. (Neh. 1:1-11). In 2 Peter 3:9, God is not willing that any should perish but that **all** should come to repentance. "Confess your faults one to another and pray for one another that you may be healed." (Jas. 5:16) It however, takes humility to acknowledge one's sins and faults and repent of them.

2) Come boldly to the Throne of Grace to obtain mercy even when you have sinned

In the belly of the fish, Jonah cried out to the Lord and God answered Him. We shouldn't allow our sins or faults to drive us away from God but in spite of them still go to Him for mercy and grace to help. The story of the prodigal son is a good example. (Luke 15)

3) Have a strong prayer life

Jesus told the disciples "watch and pray, lest you enter into temptation. The spirit indeed is willing but the flesh is weak." (Matt. 26:41) The answer to the weakness of the flesh is a life of prayer. This isn't just praying when we have sinned but praying to receive grace to help in time of need. Jesus, in the days of His flesh, offered up prayers and supplications with vehement cries and tears to Him who was able to save Him from death. (Heb. 5:7)

4) Show mercy to others

"Blessed are the merciful,

for they shall obtain mercy." (Matt. 5:7) The story of the unforgiving servant in Matthew 18 runs this point home. He was thrown into the prison to be tortured until he paid his debt, because he had refused to forgive his fellow servant. Jesus said we shouldn't judge lest we be judged and with the same measure you use it will be measured back to you. (Matt. 7:2)

Dealing with Insecurities in Relationships

We all have insecurities and these come up very much in our interpersonal relationships. My wife has done a series of messages on "Overcoming Insecurities" and "Winning the Identity Battle", I highly recommend these. In this brief article we are looking at dealing with insecurities within the context of personal relationships.

UNDERSTANDING INSECURITIES

The foundation of this problem is the fallen nature of man. When Adam and Eve fell from glory, the first sign of their state was fear when they heard the voice of God. Fear is the foundation of all insecurities. Fear of failure, fear of losing out, fear of the unknown, and all aspects of fear have their roots in the Adamic nature. In interpersonal relationships, these fears show up as insecurities. Why are we usually insecure? We are human, we have our fears and doubts; and we are not usually sure what lies ahead of us. After getting born again, we need to reorder our priorities. We cannot allow ourselves to keep on living in the fears that are rooted in the old man- Adam's nature. **We can only stop fear when we let our faith in God, define our lives. Fear and Faith are reciprocals. Feeding one, leads to starving the other.** Choose to feed your faith and starve your doubts and fears. The only reason we can live outside the boundaries of fear is because we believe that God is there in the future and in our peculiar experiences. Faith believes that God is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him. There is diligence in seeking God and allowing

His Will and Word to influence every area of our lives. Becoming strong in faith is the answer to our insecurities. We love one another with the love of God and our faith is very involved.

IDENTITY BATTLE

One of the greatest battles in dealing with insecurities is the identity battle. Who are you? What do you have? Where are you going? What are you here for? We need to develop our confidence in who we are in Christ, what we have in Him and what we can do through Him. This is the basis of a life free of insecurities. We all grow from one dimension to another. **Too many link their identities to their achievements and possessions. They measure their worth by their possessions and the opinions of others.** The Scripture that God used to deliver me from a major insecurity problem was John 5:44. It reads thus in the amplified translation: *"How is it possible for you to believe [how can you learn to believe], you who [are content to seek and] receive praise and honour and glory from one another; and yet do not seek the praise and honour and glory which come from Him who alone is God?"*

Too many times we unconsciously seek these things from one another without considering God's opinion on the matter. It brought a major deliverance to me when I began to internalise the reality of this Scripture. I am still interested in people, I love them, but I no longer seek the glory that comes from them as I used to. At least, I am working towards this as a

reality in my life. When such honour comes I appreciate it, receive it and give God the glory for making it possible, but I do not try to hunt for it. When you serve the Lord Jesus, the Father will honour you and when He does, men will be his instruments to bring honour to you. We are encouraged to count some worthy of double honour, for their work in the Kingdom. When we receive any honour, we are expected to channel it for the improvement of other human beings and give God all the glory. Leave your honour in the hands of God.

We will have to learn to leave our fame, glory and all such earthly pursuits in the hands of God. **Sometime ago, in my interaction with God, this question popped up in my heart: "Would you rather obey Me or be celebrated?"** I believe the Spirit of God asked me in my heart this question. My answer was "Lord, I thought that obedience to you would lead to celebration" The answer was, "No, not necessarily." Many who served God in their times got celebrated after they died, not necessarily when they were alive and some never got celebrated at all. The celebrity status has become what many seek after today even in their little ways amongst friends and peers. These are all from the world not from God. We need to allow God to determine such things in our lives. Just serve Him and do what is right.


John Maxwell says we will all do well and do more if we don't mind who takes the credit. We need to be contribution-minded and not competition-minded. **What you contribute should be your best and done with all**

your heart. You do this when you value yourself and value who you are in the natural as well as spiritually. Our values should first be intrinsic before extrinsic. Intrinsic values are the values we place on people because they were made in the image of God not because of any achievements they have. Extrinsic values are the values based on external achievements. When we do not value God's creation intrinsically, we stand the chance of not pleasing the Creator. The poor and the rich are so valued equally on this basis. All of this will lead to understanding the principle of self respect. The values we uphold, when they are based on time-tested principles of the Word of God, will cause us to demonstrate respect for ourselves and hence enable us to have mutual respect for others. The Bible says young people should serve God while they are still able. Let us learn to serve God with the right motives and focus. When motives are wrong, our activities will not be pleasing unto God. The right motive should be our love for God, even as we obey Him. If we let our love for God and his love for us take the first priority in our lives, we will have taken the huge step in dealing with our insecurities. The right focus for our lives should be to glorify God as we look unto the perfect example who glorified the Father- Jesus Christ. Thy Kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Amen!




