We endeavour to encourage you in your walk with the Lord. Help us share this edition and many of our other products with others. We are reaching the world through our products, websites, and social media platforms.

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


a letter from Revs. Kola & Funke Eurosho

John 6:29 (NKJV)


Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He sent."

This is beginning of the good work He is doing in us. Our believing opens us up to His working in us.

Philippians 2:12-16 (NKJV)

Therefore, my beloved, as you have always obeyed, not as in my presence only, but now much more in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; for it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure. Do all things without complaining and disputing, that you may become blameless and harmless, children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world, holding fast the word of life, so that I may rejoice in the day of Christ that I have not run in vain or labored in vain.

2 Corinthians 9:8 (NKJV)

He Will Complete What He Started

Read Philippians 1:3-7

In God's program for His people, He has begun many good things for them. But sometimes their lack of participation has hindered the completion of the work. From salvation, to maturity in Christ, to fulfilling destiny, a process is involved if we are going to see the completion of many good works that God has begun in us.

Things that can enhance the completion of the good work will include prayers, knowledge and participation. Our knowledge will enhance our effectiveness in prayer; and our obedience in participation with the process is necessary for the work to reach completion in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:28-30 (NKJV)

And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose. For whom He foreknew, He also predestined to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. Moreover whom He predestined, these He also called; whom He called, these He also justified; and whom He justified, these He also glorified.

When we get saved and begin to live the life of a saved person, we can actually demonstrate our love for God through our obedience, worship and willingness to please Him. Our salvation positions us to experience being called according to His purpose, because He foreknew us and predestined us to be conformed to the image of His Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

The whole picture is that we were created in God's image, but sin came and obliterated that image; His original plan was rekindled by the sending of His Son to pay the eternal sacrifice for our redemption, restoration and full reconciliation back into the family of God.

Genesis 1:26-28 (NKJV)

Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

We were created to reflect the glory of God, but sin cut that short. Thank God that sin was not the end of the story! The redemption in Christ brought us back to the restoration of the glory, the image and the authority we have in Christ Jesus.

THINGS THAT CAN ENHANCE THE COMPLETION OF THE GOOD WORK WILL INCLUDE PRAYERS, KNOWLEDGE AND PARTICIPATION.

Romans 3:23 (NKJV) For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.

Hebrews 1:1-4 (NKJV)

God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high, having become so much better than the angels, as He has by inheritance obtained a more excellent name than they.

Jesus Christ is the brightness of God's glory and the express image of His person. We are predestined to be conformed to the image of the Son, who is the express image of the Father, in whose image we were originally created.

Jesus Christ is the pattern Son, our example! The grace to become like Him is readily available to us as we pursue being conformed to Him in character and power. Character development into Christlikeness implies denying the flesh and yielding to the love of God. Developing a power-consciousness in Christ demands that we develop compassion for people and believe in the power of God at work in and through us. So we see faith and love as the two power tools to see to the completion of the work in us.

Faith and Love

Faith is the tool that lays hold on what God has provided for us in Christ through grace. It comes by hearing the Word of God, and we please God by responding to our challenges by faith.

Romans 10:6-11 (NKJV)

But the righteousness of faith speaks in this way, "Do not say in your heart, 'Who will ascend into heaven?' " (that is, to bring Christ down from above) or, " 'Who will descend into the abyss?' " (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? "The word is near you, in your mouth and in your heart" (that is, the word of faith which we preach): that if you confess with your mouth the Lord Jesus and believe in your heart that God has raised Him from the dead, you will be saved. For with the heart one believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto salvation. For the Scripture says, "Whoever believes on Him will not be put to shame."

Hebrews 11:1-6 (NKJV)

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. 2 For by it the elders obtained a good testimony. By faith we understand that the worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible. By faith Abel offered to God a more excellent sacrifice than Cain, through which he obtained witness that he was righteous, God testifying of his gifts; and through it he being dead still speaks. By faith Enoch was taken away so that he did not see death, "and was not found, because God had taken him"; for before he was taken he had this testimony, that he pleased God. But without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him.

James 1:2-8 (NKJV)

My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing. If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him. 6 But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways.

Read Mark 11:22-24

Galatians 3:5-9 (NKJV)

Therefore He who supplies the Spirit to you and works miracles among you, does He do it by the works of the law, or by the hearing of faith?— just as Abraham "believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." Therefore know that only those who are of faith are sons of Abraham. And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel to Abraham beforehand, saying, "In you all the nations shall be blessed." So then those who are of faith are blessed with believing Abraham.

Galatians 5:6 (NKJV)

For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but faith working through love.

So we see faith as instrumental in our receiving of salvation in Christ as we believe in our hearts and confess with our mouths. Faith is also the tool needed to see the power of God by His Spirit. This is demonstrated in and through us, as we speak to mountains, believing in our hearts and confessing with our mouths. We see that living by faith is a lifestyle that pleases God. It will be tried but we maintain our victorious lifestyle by counting it all joy when trials come. Our faith will be very productive when we are walking in the love of God.

Romans 5:1-11 (NKJV)

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character, hope. Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us.

(Also read verses 6-11)

Participation by Walking in God's Love

God loves us and has shed His love in our hearts. As we walk in love and demonstrate our faith, character is built in us and His power is demonstrated through us. Practicing love and faith are the defining aspects of our lives as we allow the work in us to come to completion.

1 Corinthians 13:4-8 (NKJV)

Love suffers long and is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never fails. But whether there are prophecies, they will fail; whether there are tongues, they will cease; whether there is knowledge, it will vanish away.

The secret to the completion of the work He started in us at salvation (till the coming of Christ) is found in us waking up to our new identity, our new authority and our new lifestyle of faith and love. The regular obedience to the Word of God plays a great role in our walk with God: renewal of our minds, maintaining our joy through gratitude, regular practice of praise and worship, and regularly winning souls to the Lord through evangelism. All these enhance our participation in the process for God to finish what He started in us from our salvation to the fulfilment of our destiny. Read Colossians 3:1-17.

Remain strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. God bless you!



ut without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is, and that He is a rewarder of those who diligently seek Him" (Heb. 11:6). Also, God said He didn't call the descendants of Jacob to seek Him in vain (or for nothing), but "promised them a just reward" (Isa. 45:19 AMP). God is not unjust to forget our work and labor of love (Heb. 6:10); but will "reward each one of us for the good we do" (Eph. 6:8 NLT). Jesus said, our Father who sees (our giving, praying and fasting) in secret; will Himself reward us openly (Matt. 6:3-18)!

God said we will again see the difference between those who serve Him, and those who don't; "On the day that I make them My jewels. And I will spare them as a man spares his own son who serves him" (Mal. 3:17c).

This tells us that it is the son who serves that gets rewarded; you don't get rewarded just because you're a child of God!

So, having established by the Scriptures that it's in God's plan to reward those who seek Him; let's go on to examine some of the rewards.

1. YOU WILL FIND GOD:

Jesus said, "seek, and you will find" (Luke 11:9b); it therefore follows that when you seek God; you WILL find Him! God said, "I would not have told the people of Israel to seek Me if I could not be found" (Isa. 45:19b NLT). God "cares enough to respond to those who seek him" (Heb. 11:6 MSG). God promises that we will find Him, when we seek Him with all our heart (Jer. 29:13).

God Himself will be your reward; He said to Abraham, "Do not be afraid, Abram. I am your shield, your exceedingly great reward" (Gen. 15:1). The Psalmist said, "O Lord, You are the portion of my inheritance and my cup" (Ps. 16:5a). See also Ps. 119:57a,142:5 and Lam. 3:24.

2. GOD'S PRESENCE:

'When You said, "Seek My face," My heart said to You, "Your face, Lord, I will seek" (Ps. 27:8). God's face is His Presence; and He will not hide His face from you when you seek it!

In His Presence, you will find:

I. STRENGTH

"Wait on the Lord; Be of good courage, And He shall strengthen your heart; Wait, I say, on the Lord!" (Ps. 27:14).

"But those who wait on the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings like eagles, they shall run and not be weary, they shall walk and not faint" (Isaiah 40:31).

II. CONFIDENCE

"I have set the Lord always before me; Because He is at my right hand I shall not be moved" (Ps. 16:8). This means we will face life confidently; not being afraid of anyone or any circumstances. "The Lord is my light and my salvation; Whom shall I fear? The Lord is the strength of my life; Of whom shall I be afraid? Though an army may encamp against me, My heart shall not fear; Though war may rise against me, In this I will be confident" (Ps. 27:1,3). And even when you walk through the valley of the shadow of death, you will fear no evil; because of God's presence with you (Ps. 23:4).

III. REST

And He said, "My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." (Ex. 33:14)

"He leads me beside the still and restful waters." (Ps. 23:2c AMP)

IV. SEPARATION

God's Presence with us distinguishes us from other people; it makes all the difference in our lives and in what we do! Moses pleaded with God, for His Presence to go with them. He said, "For Your presence among us sets Your people and me apart from all other people on the earth" (Ex. 33:16c NLT).

V. VICTORY

God's Presence with us guarantees victory.

When God told Gideon he would be used to deliver the Israelites from the oppression of the Midianites, Gideon said he was unqualified and inadequate for the job. But God said to him, "Surely I will be with you, and you shall defeat the Midianites as one man" (Judg. 6:14-16).

VI. PROTECTION

"For in the time of trouble He shall hide me in His pavilion; In the secret place of His tabernacle He shall hide me; He shall set me high upon a rock. And now my head shall be lifted up above my enemies all around me;" (Ps. 27:5-6a). And of those who fear God and trust in Him, the Psalmist also said, "You shall hide them in the secret place of Your presence from the plots of man; You shall keep them secretly in a pavilion from the strife of tongues" (Ps. 31:19c-20).

It is the son who serves that gets rewarded ...

VII. JOY AND REJOICING

"You will show me the path of life; In Your presence is fullness of joy; At Your right hand are pleasures forevermore." (Ps. 16:11) "Because You have been my help, Therefore

in the shadow of Your wings I will rejoice." (Ps. 63:7)

3. ANSWERS TO PRAYERS:

We will receive whatever we are seeking God for; God said, "Then you will call upon Me and go and pray to Me, and I will listen to you" (Jer. 29:12). Jesus said, "how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask Him!" (Matt. 7:11c)

Cornelius was told by the angel, "Your prayers and your alms have come up for a memorial before God" (Acts 10:4). The angel said to Zacharias, "for your prayer is heard; and your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son," (Luke 1:13).

There's always a sense of satisfaction and fulfilment that comes with answers to prayers! "Ask, and you will receive, that your joy may be full" (John 16:24c). Zacharias was told that his wife was going to have a son; the angel added, "And you will have joy and gladness, and many will rejoice at his birth" (Luke 1:14). Jesus said those who hunger and thirst after righteousness shall be satisfied (Matt. 5:6). God promised to "pour water on him who is thirsty, and floods on the dry ground" (Isa. 44:3b). This was why the Psalmist said, "My soul shall be satisfied as with marrow and fatness, And my mouth shall praise You with joyful lips" (Ps. 63:5).

God promised to turn things around for us, when we seek Him wholeheartedly in prayers; He said, "I will end your captivity and restore your fortunes" (Jer 29:14a NLT). God defeated the nations that came against Jehoshaphat and gave him rest all around; because he and Judah sought God for help (2 Chron. 20). The Psalmist said, "I sought the Lord, and He heard me, and delivered me from all my fears. The righteous cry out, and the Lord hears, and delivers them out of all their troubles. Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the Lord delivers him out of them all" (Psalms 34:4,17,19). God has never (and will never) forsake those who seek Him (Ps. 9:10)!

4. GOD'S PROVISION:

"The young lions lack and suffer hunger; but those who seek the Lord shall not lack any good thing" (Ps. 34:10). Jesus said, we should seek first God's Kingdom and righteousness; and all the other things shall be added to us. That is, we wouldn't have to worry or be anxious about our needs - because they would be met by our heavenly Father (Matt. 6:31-33)! God will not withhold any good thing from those who walk uprightly (Ps. 84:11); He is "good to those who wait for Him, to the soul who seeks Him" (Lam 3:25).

5. BLESSINGS AND VINDICATION:

"They will receive blessing from the Lord and vindication from God their Savior. Such is the generation of those who seek him, who seek your face, God of Jacob." (Ps. 24:5-6a NIV)

"Blessed are those who keep His testimonies, Who seek Him with the whole heart!" (Ps. 119:2)

God delights in the prosperity and wellbeing of His servants (Ps. 35:27). He said, "So you shall serve the Lord your God, and He will bless your bread and your water. And I will take sickness away from the midst of you. No one shall suffer miscarriage or be barren in your land; I will fulfill the number of your days" (Ex. 23:25-26). And Isaiah 54:17 says, "But in that coming day no weapon turned against you will succeed. You will silence every voice raised up to accuse you. These benefits are enjoyed by the servants of the Lord; their vindication will come from Me. I, the Lord, have spoken" (NLT).

No matter how bad a situation looks in the natural, we can always find hope in God's Word!

6. HOPE:

One of the benefits of seeking God is hopefulness. The Bible says, "And the Scriptures give us hope and encouragement as we wait patiently for God's promises to be fulfilled" (Rom.15:4c NLT).

No matter how bad a situation looks in the natural, we can always find hope in God's Word. The Psalmist said, "You are my hiding place and my shield; I hope in Your word" (Ps. 119:114). And God said those who hope in Him will not be disappointed (Isa.49:23 NIV)!

7. UNDERSTANDING AND REVELATION:

"'Call to me and I will answer you and tell you great and unsearchable things you do not know'" (Jer. 33:3 NIV). God said He will tell us things we could never have figured out on our own - the things which "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, nor have entered into the heart of man" (1 Cor. 2:9-10); He reveals them to us by His Spirit who lives in us!

The Bible says, "No one can know a person's thoughts except that person's own spirit" (1 Cor. 2:11a NLT); so it was a naturally impossible thing for king Nebuchadnezzar's wise men to be able to tell the king his own dream! So they told the king, "No one on earth can tell the king his dream! The king's demand is impossible. No one except the gods can tell you your dream, and they do not live here among people" (Dan. 2:10a,11 NLT).

However, Daniel and his friends knew that they were in touch with the God who reveals deep and secret things, and knows what is in the darkness; so they sought Him, and the dream was revealed to Daniel in a night vision (Dan. 2:16-23). The Bible says, "Evil men do not understand justice, But those who seek the Lord understand all" (Prov. 28:5). The Psalmist said he was envious of the wicked when he saw their prosperity, and his foot almost slipped; until but when he went into God's sanctuary and he saw the whole picture (Ps. 73). Like the folks who said, "It is useless to serve God"; because arrogant people seemed to be blessed, evil people are the ones getting rich and even get away with contempt of God! But God said there will again be a visible difference between the righteous and the wicked; between those who serve God and those who do not (Mal.3:14-18).

The Bible says, "Yes, if you cry out for discernment, And lift up your voice for understanding, If you seek her as silver, and search for her as for hidden treasures; then you will understand the fear of the Lord, and find the knowledge of God" (Prov. 2:3-5). It is therefore our responsibility to seek understanding. God made known His ways to Moses and His acts to the children of Israel (Ps. 103:7). We mustn't be like the Israelites, who seemed contented to see God's acts, we must also be interested in knowing His ways; God said, "But let him who glories glory in this, that he understands and knows Me" (Jer. 9:24b).

God is not a respecter of persons; Jesus said, "Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and he who seeks finds, and to him who knocks it will be opened" (Matt. 7:7-8).

Jehovah Jireh, You are enough. I will be content in every circumstance. You are more than enough, always enough, forever enough." These words are the defining stance of my life right now and I can never let go of them, because God has been too faithful to me. My life is a fountain full of blessings.

After my National Service in Ghana (2018), I decided to work at the church for a while. It was something I felt in my spirit to do. This decision was met with much scepticism from friends and even some family members. However, with the support of my parents, I went ahead. After working there for a year (February 2019 - March 2020), I was offered a job at an oil and gas company. I didn't want it at first because I was really enjoying myself in the ministry. Well, after receiving some advice from my parents, I went for the interview in March 2020 and the moment I finished the interview, I was given the job. I didn't know what to expect when I was going into the interview. I was all nerves but I trusted God for His will to be done. When I got the job, I could not say or do anything but praise God!

I started the job just two weeks before the lockdown in Ghana due to the COVID-19 pandemic, but I was assured that it would not affect anything. All I had to do was work from home and stay safe. So I was excited!

My excitement was however, short lived. Just three months into the job, I was let go because the company could not afford me anymore due to the losses they had incurred as a result of the lockdown. I was shattered and I even got depressed at a time. Many around me didn't know I had lost my job. It took my parents' prayers and encouragement and my personal warfare to get me out of the state I was in. I began to pray to God to breakthrough for me, and He did. I got word of a contract to be a consultant on a project. I applied for it and was offered the appointment in September 2020.

Whilst I was on this contract job, I received an invitation to come for an interview in an insurance company. This was a totally new field for me so I had fears, but the words that kept me going were that, "I am the head and not the tail, above only and never beneath", "I have the mind of Christ", and "I am a child of God and I abound in the grace of God upon the house, Fountain of Wisdom Ministries". So I knew that I had no choice but to excel. I remember the interview panel asking me if I was sure I had never worked in the insurance sector before, because they felt there was no way I could have been able to answer the questions so accurately and detailed without relevant experience. This could only have been God at work!

After the interview, I felt so confident and excited! I was so sure they would be calling me that same day or very soon. But God humbled me, he made me realise the need for waiting. He said to me, "I will make you wait to get stronger for what I have in store for you". Wow! That really shut me up. I got a call and an email a month later, offering me the job and asking me when I wanted to start work. They were allowing me to start the job on my terms. I told them one month, so that I could give notice. I have been on my new job now for one month and it has been great! What God cannot do, does not exist! He turned my mourning into dancing! I give Him all the glory and I praise Him for always being so faithful to His Word. Our God is an awesome God!

TIME IN THE WORD

One of the ways we seek God's face is by spending time in His Word. His Word reveals His mind, His ways, His will and His plans for us. Jesus said, "If you abide in Me, and my words abide in you, you will ask what you desire and it shall be done for you" (John 15:7). God and His Word are one, so, if we have His Word abiding in us, when we pray, our prayers will be in alignment with His will. As we fellowship with His Word, His Word begins to shape even our desires and then when we ask what we desire, we get it! "Delight yourself also in the Lord, and He shall give you the desires of your heart" (Psalm 37:4). Psalm 1 talks about the man who delights in the law of the Lord and meditates in it day and night. God's Word is not only His will; it is also His covenant and His bond. We come to Him based on His Word - the provisions of His Word. There are matters that God has hidden in His Word; not from us, but for us, and it is our glory to search them out. The Bible says the things which are revealed to us belong to us and our children forever (Deuteronomy 29:29) but the responsibility is ours to dig them out. We must position ourselves in the study of, and meditation in the Word of God to reveal those things to us.

THE ONE OUR HEARTS DESIRED

We were told that we would not be able to conceive naturally...

umbers 23 verse 19 says that God is not a man that He should lie and we can testify to this. James 1:17 further says, 'Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the father of heavenly lights who does not change like shifting shadows.' All His promises are true and our lives today are a testimony of that. We got married in 2013 and like many hopeful newlyweds, we thought we would be able to start our family straight away. Little did we know that we would wait seven years in total for our miracle to happen. In that time, we learnt a lot, including understanding God as a Father, and standing on His promises even when circumstances suggested otherwise. But mostly we learnt to trust God - not only with bits and pieces of our lives but with everything. After years of hearing all kinds of bleak news from doctors and specialists regarding our fertility, and a few operations, we were told conclusively that we would not be able to conceive naturally and our best bet was to try IVF. This matter was considered closed by the NHS. We still hoped we would conceive naturally and we did not mince our words when telling the Lord of our hearts' desire despite history suggesting otherwise.

It is in times like these when your faith needs strengthening, that God also sends special people to pray for you and uplift your faith. That was a time I remember my maternal grandmother praying for me with tears in her eyes. A friend who introduced us to Harvestime Church also encouraged me as we headed to the Ladies Retreat weekend in 2019; I received prayers during that retreat. We also participated in the prayer and fasting programme, which is a quarterly programme at Harvestime Church. And we had a couple in the church who are our friends, standing in faith with us on the matter. All these people joined our family and friends who had stood with us in prayer for years. Fast forward to a few months later - we conceived for the first time in our lives and we rejoiced with every fibre of our being! We thanked God and rejoiced. Unfortunately we miscarried a few weeks later. During this time we had many questions that we had no answers to, but still, we trusted God. A month later, we got pregnant again and thanked the Lord. During the pregnancy and beyond, there was not a single day that we woke up and were not overwhelmed with gratitude in our hearts.

The pregnancy was met with a few complications and as a result the baby came early at 28 weeks at only 1.03kg. In total, it would be 51 days before we could take the baby home from the very capable hands of the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) of St Peter's hospital. Even through this ordeal, God steadied our hearts and strengthened our faith. Not only did the Harvestime Church family support us by praying for us, friends cooked for us, visited to see the baby - even if it meant seeing the baby through the window to observe covid guidelines - messaged us, called us and just showed love. For this we are forever grateful.

Our little boy's name is called Wataida Liam. In our home language Wataida means 'the one our hearts desired', and truly this is what we got. Liam means 'strong willed fighter', and through God's unending grace he was able to fight through all the challenges before him and will continue to do so. We thank God for trusting us to be custodians and continue to pray for guidance and grace to raise him in the way of the Lord. We hope our story encourages someone who is waiting on the Lord for something; it's never easy but God is faithful, always.

W

hen our twin girls were much smaller, we would occasionally get asked about the "then" apparent size difference between them. Many people weren't aware that Tino and I had an extremely challenging pregnancy; high risk from the start due to the type of twins we were carrying (Monochorionic Diamniotic Twins: MCDA).

At about 16 weeks, our world was shaken when we were told that one of our babies had a Selective Intrauterine Growth Restriction (sIUGR) due to unequal placenta sharing (leading to one baby being born significantly smaller). The doctors told us upfront that our "smaller" baby might not even make it, and that the diagnosis might also become life threatening for our other baby as well. In summary, we were told that we may need to make the heartbreaking decision to save one baby rather than lose both. There were talks to deliver the babies as early as 25-27 weeks by c-section to ensure that at least our "normal" size baby would be given a better survival chance by being monitored outside of the womb, in the instance that our "smaller" baby stopped growing all together.

It being our first pregnancy, the doctor's report felt a little overwhelming. We were a little discouraged and worried. We made both Pastor Funke and Rev. Kola aware of the situation, and sought their help through prayers and guidance. Pastor Funke was extremely encouraging and supportive from the very beginning - she reminded us of God's Word, His promises. She really believed for us. She listened to our concerns and regularly took the time to check-up on us for updates (I personally really appreciated this, it showed her caring nature). Rev Kola also reached out to Tino on numerous occasions (I know this was extremely encouraging to him also). During one of the prayers led by Pastor Funke, she declared that the girls were "signs and wonders from the start and will continue to be". I really took what she said literally and applied my faith in prayer based on what she had declared over the girls (even now, it is something I continuously pray over my daughters).


Our pregnancy was closely monitored; at some point we were even having scans twice a week. We were referred to leading specialists in the U.K. During that period we cried, we prayed, we remained positive, we meditated on God's Word and promises, we drew so much strength from our families, pastors and Harvestime church and close friends (we are so very grateful for you all). We took each day at a time; we celebrated these little victories. Our girls kept us going, seeing their little faces during our various scans kept us pushing. Our girls fought hard; each week they kept on progressing and growing, contrary to all medical expectations. At our final scan the specialist stated, "I don't know what you've been doing, but it is working". We knew it was the prayers!

Our girls arrived at 34 weeks: healthy and well alive! We spent less than 2 weeks in NICU (a special thanks to Auntie Kwai Yeng who was supportive and encouraging during our time at the Hospital. A special thanks also, to our friends Liz and Obi Emelogu for all their prayers and support). Seeing our girls continuously growing and flourishing is truly fulfilling and a constant reminder of God's Faithfulness.





MUSICAL EXCELLENCE

e had a chat with Pastor Victor Charles, the music minister at Word of Faith Christian Centre (WOFCC), Kano. The music ministry is made up of the worship ministry and the Tabernacle of David (TOD) choir. With about 20 years of experience, Pastor Victor shares some insights into the existence and projects of this popularly known and anointed group of musicians and vocalists.

1. Please introduce Fountain Music. What is the vision behind it?

Rev. Kola has always expressed his desire to see different ministries flow out of Fountain of Wisdom Ministries (FOWM) and bless the nations. Fountain Music was born out of a need to discover, develop and provide a platform for young music ministers to express and fulfill their ministries to the larger body of Christ.

2. As pastor in charge of music at WOFCC (Kano), how has your experience shaped the way you approach music and lead others?

I have had the privilege of leading the music team here for about 20 years now and I think one key ingredient to getting the best out of creative people to cast a compelling vision for what needs to be done. Once you can get them to believe in a project and why it should be done, you will unleash their creative energy.



3. Please tell us about the latest project, 'EZEM O'.

We (TOD choir members) have always had a desire to share songs written from the house, with the world. I had just taken the choir through some lessons on song writing, and the song 'Ezem O' (My King) came from a practical session to implement some of the techniques we had just learnt. The idea for the song came during one of our rehearsals. At the end of that particular rehearsal, the musicians were enjoying a freestyle session and were vibing to what was being played. I liked it and decided to record it! I made a catchy loop out of it in the studio and launched what I called 'the melody challenge'. Choir members were encouraged to use the loop and come up with catchy melodies. Armed with the main idea for the song and a catchy melody, we started fleshing out some lyrics which we finished in the studio working with a smaller group of people.

4. What was the inspiration behind the song 'Ezem O'?

The inspiration for 'Ezem O' came on the heel of the pandemic, when the world was clueless and in serious fear. We strengthened ourselves with the truth that we have a King who knows all about what was happening and that we are safe under His government because we can always count on his goodness.

5. What was the reason behind doing a live recording for 'Ezem O'? And how do live recordings differ from studio recordings, from a production stand point? What elements are needed to attain quality for both styles of production?

We opted for a live recording because there is a 'magic' to it - something very organic about getting musicians who understand one another in a room to play together. It's difficult to replicate that in a studio. We did a lot of overdubs in the studio to fine-tune the ideas after we had captured the energy and anointing during the live performance.

To have a successful live recording you must get the pre-productions right. The band must know their stuff and be comfortable playing with stems (if you are using that). You need a good recording engineer/s that knows what they doing and a producer/s that knows the sound they are going for, among other things.

In a studio recording (recording live instruments) you have more time and you can be more detailed. If it's a big studio where the band can play together, you can still get that 'magic' I spoke about. I can't say the same about the singers; it's difficult to get the same intensity you get from singers on stage, in the studio.

The key to achieving good quality in both methods is to get it right at the source. There are a lot of things we can try to fix through edits in the studio but if the performance or recording is mediocre from source, you will end up with a less than perfect product (it's difficult to polish if the source is not good).

6. What elements should every good song-writing process have?

The recipe I teach for writing a great song is: great idea + great hook + great melody + great lyrics = great song. The idea is arguably the most important element; that is your 'north star'; without it you can get lost in the process. The second most important one after you have mined the main idea (by researching it and understanding it well) is the hook: this is a catchy phrase around which you will build your lyrics - in our case *Ezem O*.

7. What challenges did you face while bringing the project together? How did you overcome those challenges?

It would have been easier to just sit down with a few good song writers and come up with a song. Getting people who never saw themselves as song writers to buy into it and make themselves available to contribute was initially very difficult. In the end I believe it was worth it, we are trying to develop a culture of song writing and I think it helped stir the belief in many that they know how to do it.

8. What advice would you give to choristers and singers who are working towards developing their vocals and their ability to minister?

For people interested in developing their voices, I think they must really want to. There is free content on YouTube and other platforms to guide them but they must be willing to pay the price and invest in developing their voices. On being more effective in ministering songs: like Rev. Mum often says, 'ministry is an outflow of your life'. Spend time on the technical aspect of preparing to minister a song, but more time in preparing your heart to minister the song. If it's coming from a place of sincerity and authenticity in your heart, God can use it to do great things.

A good resource that we have been using at church is worshiptraining.com. It's a hub containing many music/worship related training for music teams. We subscribe as a team and give members access to the site. We also arrange discussion sessions where we come together to share and build upon what we learnt on a particular topic.

9. What should we look forward to from Fountain Music in for next 5 years?

We are trusting God to grow into a major music label in Nigeria, alongside artists who are making an impact in the Nigerian gospel music scene.

n 2014 I gave birth to my eldest son, Timothy. I know God was with me and went before me, but it was not the birth I was trusting God for. I will go so far as to say that what I experienced was almost the exact opposite of what I was believing for. My labour, for reasons unknown to the medical team, was not progressing. When I eventually did get to 9cm dilated, I was told that my baby had gone into distress and that I needed to have an emergency caesarean section immediately. I remember quietly crying as they wheeled me to theatre, it was not supposed to happen this way. In the midst of it all, God spoke to me and I remembered Psalm 23:4, "Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil; For You are with me ... ". That Word gave me the peace and assurance I needed at that moment and I knew that everything would be okay.

Four years later I was pregnant again with my second child. I was trusting God for the birth that I wanted. I did not want another caesarean. I wanted a natural birth. My pregnancy went smoothly however because of my previous caesarean I was given a deadline date after which time if the baby had not arrived, I would be booked in for a caesarean. I was confident that my baby would show up well before the deadline date, after all, my son had arrived 3 days early; but my deadline date soon arrived and still no sign of baby. At this point I was trusting God that He could still turn things around. I was thankfully sent home when I arrived for my appointment as all the theatre rooms were full. I remember praying, "Lord we're running out of time". When I returned to the hospital the next morning contractions had started. I was given a room and the team told me they would leave me for four hours then check on how things were progressing. Four hours later I was told that my labour was not progressing. The same thing I was told when I had my son. Fear arose in me because it seemed like what happened the first-time round was about to happen again. I was told that I could either be induced or go for a c-section. I didn't want either option. So they reluctantly agreed to leave me for another four hours. I was quite low emotionally; again I

was bombarded with thoughts of, "it's not supposed to be like this" and "what did I do wrong?". It was around that time that I got a call from Pastor Funke to check up on me. Her words and encouragement gave me the strength I needed to hold on in faith. She asked me what I wanted, and I said a natural birth, then she agreed with me in prayer! The medical team came back to check on me and labour had progressed. What happened next was like a whirlwind, everything seemed to suddenly kick into high gear and before I knew it the midwife was calling the doctor because it was time to push. My little trailblazer arrived - naturally! No induction needed, no caesarean needed. God did it for me.

The lesson I learnt that day is to never ever withdraw my faith! To keep holding on in faith and trusting God no matter what! The script seemed to have already been written out and all roads seemed to be pointing towards a c-section and a repeat of what happened last time, but I was not going to withdraw my faith. I learnt that day what it means to fight the good fight of faith. Just because you believe something, does not mean it will not be tested or shaken. Our job is to remain in faith! To fight the good fight of faith! It is a lesson that has carried me through many other challenges since. Our God is faithful. I give Him all the glory.
